

Solid Granny Square

Step by Step Photo Tutorial

To begin, put the yarn on the hook by making a slip knot. I like to wrap the yarn around my finger twice.



Put the left piece of string over the right piece of string.



Repeat by putting the new left piece of string over the new right piece of string. Slip knot made, pull working yarn to make the loop smaller.



Chain 4.



Insert hook into the first chain to form a U on the hook.



Slip stitch (yarn over, pull through first and second loops on hook).



Chain 3



Double Crochet (dc) into the ring formed
(dc: yarn over, insert hook, yarn over,
pull through two loops, yarn over, pull
through remaining two loops).



Dc eleven times into the ring.



Slip stitch into the top of the beginning chain 3.



Chain 5.



Chain 5.



When you make the treble stitch, you're going to do your first insert into the slip stitch of the previous round. It will be the very first space after the chain. This is NOT the stitch at the top of your first dc.



Treble stitch (tr): yarn over twice, insert hook, pull through, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through remaining 2 loops.



Double Crochet (dc) two times into the very next stitch, which is one dc from the previous round.



Again, double crochet two times in the next stitch.



Treble crochet into the next stitch, chain 2.



Treble crochet again into the same stitch.



Repeat pattern: two double crochet in each of next two stitches (2dc 2x).



Continue the repetition by treble crochet, chain 2, treble crochet into the next, same stitch. (tr ch2 tr).



Repeat entirely, double crochet two times in each of next two stitches and treble crochet, chain 2, treble crochet in the next stitch after those.



Double crochet two times in each of remaining next two stitches.



Insert hook into the third chain.



Slip stitch (yarn over, pull through two loops) to finish round.




Chain 5. Treble crochet around the chain space of the previous round.



Double crochet twice into the next stitch (which happens to be a treble stitch of the previous round).



Double crochet evenly across by putting one double crochet stitch into each of next four stitches.



In the last stitch before the chain (which is a treble stitch from previous round), you will place two double crochet stitches.



Treble crochet around the chain of the previous round, chain two, treble crochet again still around the previous round's chain.




Repeat previous three steps: double crochet two times in same stitch, double crochet evenly across in next four stitches, double crochet two times in same stitch, treble crochet around the chain of previous round, chain two, treble crochet around chain of previous round.



On the last edge of the square, it is going to appear as if you can ONLY may the four worked evenly double crochet stitched; yet we must complete the pattern of adding two double crochet in the same stitch.



You're going to add the final two double crochet stitches into the same space by putting them into the slip stitch of the previous round. You'll find it at the base of your round's beginning chain.



Add both of the two double crochet into that space highlighted in previous image.



Slip stitch into the third chain.



You may continue this pattern to achieve any size square. Simply increase the number of worked evenly across double crochet stitches, always working two double crochet stitched into the same space after and before the treble stitches; corners are done the same: treble, chain two, treble. At the conclusion of any round, break yarn and fasten.
