

BOBBLE BOOT CUFFS



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INSTRUCTIONS

Terms Used

hdc- half double crochet

double crochet- double crochet

bobble st - 4 double crochet together

sk- skip

ch- chain

yo- yarn over

About

You can make this cuff in any size. Cuff is made flat, and seamed up.

This tutorial is made to be used in tandem with a youtube video. Video can be seen here. (<----- clickable link)

You will need:

- 300 yards of worsted weight yarn in two colors. 200 in main color and 100 in contrast color
- Size 4.0 mm crochet hook
- Yarn needle for weaving in ends.
- A leg to put the finished item on.



PATTERN

Part one: Cuff

Ch 14, sk 1st ch, 13 hdc.

Row 1: ch 1 and turn. hdc all sts.

Repeat row one until you have a piece long enough to wrap around your ankle where you want the cuff to lay.

Part two: Bobbles:

Now we will work across the top. Work this set up row:

Ch 1, and hdc across the top of the work. You want your sts to be multiples of 4 + 1. This means when you are done your sts can evenly be divided by four + one extra stitch. For example, I might have 24 sts. This is divided by 4 to give me 6. Now I would add one extra stitch to have 25 sts.

Row 1: Ch 1 and turn. Using your main color, do 3 hdc. From here on out know that all bobble sts are worked with the contrast color. Only the bobble sts are contrast colors until the very last row. Assume that every other st will be worked in the main color.

In the 4th st we will work a bobble st. A bobble st is four double crochet stitches together. This means you will make four double crochets without pulling through the last two loops, and then to create a bobble, and pull through all the loops on the hook using the main color. **Written out, a bobble st looks like this: * using contrast color, yarn over, insert hook in st, pull up loop, yo, pull through 2 loops* repeat from * three more times in SAME st. Then yarn over with main color and pull through all loops on the hook.**

Row one, without the lengthy explanation looks like this: ch 1 and turn *3 hdc in main color, 1 bobble st. repeat from * around until last st. In the last st, do one hdc with main color.

Row 2: Cut your red yarn, leaving a tail to weave in. Using main color only, ch 1 and turn and hdc all sts.

Row 3: 1 hdc * 1 bobble st, 3 hdc* repeat from * until end. Only the bobble sts are worked in the contrast color. Make sure to keep all yarn “runs” to the back.

Row 4: Cut your red yarn again, leaving a tail to weave in. Using main color only, ch 1 and turn and hdc all sts.

Row 5: *3 hdc in main color, 1 bobble st. repeat from * around until last st. In the last st, do one hdc with main color.

Row 6: Cut red yarn again, leaving a tail to weave in. Using main color only, ch 1 and turn and hdc all sts. You can cut the main color now, as we will be working with just the contrast color.

Row 7: (worked in only contrast color) insert hook into first st, and pull up a loop. ch 3, and then sc into the same st you pulled up a loop in. Now, *sk 1 st, and sc into the next st. ch 3 again and sc into the same st you just sc into. repeat from * around

Weave in all ends.

Make two and wear! It's really important when doing the top and making the hdc set up row for your second cuff that you have the same number of sts across. Or else your other cuff will have more or less bobbles than the first.
