

## Gamer Jacket



Inspired by my gamer husbands love of the video game Assassin's Creed, this jacket is simple and works

up quickly. Made with an easy-care, soft, thick and affordable yarn, this is bound to be a staple in your gamers closet!! ( or anyone's without the pointed hood!)



**Yarn-Hobby Lobby's I Love This Yarn! 7 oz**

198gms 355yds 325meters

**Hook-** I/9-5.50mm

**Notions-** 1" buttons 6- 10 depending on size and how many buttons you want  
Measuring tape- you will need to measure as you work.

**Gauge-** 14 sts= 4" or 3.5 sts per inch (row gauge isn't important since you will be measuring as you work, no row counting)

**Sizes-** 2-4 yrs (4-6 yrs, 6-8 yrs, 8-10 yrs, x-small, small, medium, large, x-large, xx-large)- 22 (24, 26, 28, 30, 34, 38, 42, 46, 50)" chest circumference  
*Be sure to check your measurement. Fabric is very stretchy so if you are in-between one of these sizes so smaller for a tighter fit and larger for a looser.*

**NOTES-**

Jacket is made in one piece starting at the back, then adding on the sleeves and then separating the remainder of the sleeves to add on the front panels. Seams are sewn at the sides and under the sleeves. Hood is worked onto the neck and shoulders and then a single crochet border around the hood and front panels for the buttonholes as well as the bottom.

CHAIN LOOSELY so fabric has room to stretch.

CH-2 counts as hdc throughout entire pattern

For Ease in working circle the corresponding number with the size you are making.

### Back-

Ch 38 (43, 46, 50, 53, 60, 67, 74, 81, 88)  
Row 1- Hdc in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from hook and each ch across. Turn

Next Rows- Ch 2, hdc in next hdc and each hdc across. Turn

Work evenly until piece measures 10.5 (12, 13, 15, 15, 16, 17, 17, 18, 18.5)" in length. Do not fasten off.

### Sleeves-

With separate ball of yarn join with sl st on the opposite top corner (the opposite side of your working lp) and ch 35 (42, 49, 56, 63, 66, 66, 70, 70, 73). Fasten off.

Pick up your working lp and ch 36 (43, 49, 57, 64, 67, 67, 71, 71, 74)

Next Row- Hdc in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from hook and each ch across to back, hdc in each hdc

across back, hdc in each ch across to end of other sleeve.

*TIP- Fold piece in half length-wise to*



*make sure sleeves are same length. Be sure to hdc into the st that you joined your other foundation into*

*for opposite sleeve.*

Next Rows- Ch 2, Hdc in next hdc and each hdc across.

Work evenly until sleeves measure 4.5 (5, 5.5, 6, 6.5, 7, 7, 8, 9, 10)" in width  
Do not fasten off.

### **Front of Sleeve and Front Panel**

Next Row: Ch 2, turn, Hdc in next 42 (51, 59, 66, 71, 77, 81, 87, 89, 95) hdc.  
Turn. Remaining sts will be left unworked for now.

\*Work  
evenly until sleeve measures 6  $\frac{3}{4}$  (7.5, 8  $\frac{1}{4}$ , 9, 9  $\frac{1}{4}$ , 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ , 10  $\frac{1}{2}$ , 12, 13  $\frac{1}{2}$ , 15)" in width. Do not fasten off.

If the last row ends on the cuff end of the sleeve, with a separate ball of yarn join to the 1<sup>st</sup> st of row just made (ch-2 hdc)

And ch 17 (19, 20, 23, 28, 31, 35, 37, 42, 45) Fasten off and pick up working loop from last row completed.

Next row- Ch 2, Hdc in next hdc and each hdc across, hdc in each ch across.  
Turn.

Next Rows- Same as below.

If the last row ends on the inside of the sleeve do not fasten off and continue the pattern.

Ch 18 (20, 21, 24, 29, 32, 36, 38, 43, 46)

Next Row- Hdc in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from hook and each ch across, then hdc in each hdc across to end.

Next Rows- Ch 2, hdc in next hdc and each hdc across.

Work evenly until entire sleeve measures 9 (10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 14, 16, 18, 20)

If last row ends on cuff end of sleeve fasten off.\*\*

Start counting from cuff end of sleeve and place marker in the 35<sup>th</sup> ( 42<sup>nd</sup> , 49<sup>th</sup> , 56<sup>th</sup> , 63<sup>rd</sup> . 66<sup>th</sup> , 66<sup>th</sup> , 70<sup>th</sup> , 70<sup>th</sup> , 73<sup>rd</sup> ) st

If your last row ended on the panel end:  
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If your last row ended on the cuff end of the sleeve, join with a sl st to the first st made for that row ( the inner corner of the front panel)

Next Row- Ch 2, hdc in next hdc and each hdc across to the stitch marker.  
(leaving marked st unworked)

Work panel evenly until piece measures evenly when folded over with the sleeve corners matching up. Fasten Off.

### **Other Front Sleeve and Front Panel (with buttonholes)**

Starting at the corner of the sleeve and neck edge sk the next 21 (22, 24, 28, 35, 35, 38, 42, 42) sts along neck edge.

Join yarn with sl st in next st.

Next row- Ch 2, hdc in next hdc and each hdc across. Turn

Repeat the same as other sleeve from \* to \*\*

Lay Jacket down with the sleeves and panels lined up with the back and decide where you want to place your buttons. They will be best placed somewhere close to the center of the front panel. One row of buttonholes will be made inside the final front panel to be made and the other row will be added later with the border.

If you only want one row of buttons then you can continue to work this panel in the same manner as before. Otherwise you will want to mark a stitch a few stitches away from where the other panel lies.

After you mark your stitch continue to work pattern from \*\* working a (ch-1, sk1 hdc, hdc in next hdc) over the marked st for a buttonhole.

Space the buttonholes out evenly and move your stitch marker up as you work to make sure your buttonholes will be aligned properly.

After you work this panel to the same length as this one. Fasten Off.

Whipstitch the sides and bottom of sleeves.

### **Hood**

Join yarn in the corner of the front of the sleeve and the front panel..

Row 1- Ch 1, sc in same st as join, sc evenly along row ends of sleeve, sc in each hdc across back of neck, sc evenly along row ends of sleeve stopping just before the top edge of the front panel. Turn

Next Rows- Ch 2, hdc in next st, hdc in each st across. Turn

Continue to work evenly until hood measures 8 (9, 10, 11, 11, 11, 12, 12, 12)'' in height. Fasten Off.

Here you can make the top of the hood as wide or as thin as you wish. These are just suggestions:

Count and place marker on both ends of the center 7 ( 7, 9, 11, 13, 13, 13, 13, 15, 15) sts of the last row finished.

If the stitch count of the previous row is an even number then place markers in

the center 8(8, 10, 12, 14, 14, 14, 14, 16, 16)

Join yarn with sl st in one of the marked sts, ch 2, hdc in next hdc and each hdc to the last marked st (hdc in marked st) Turn.

Next rows- Ch 2, hdc in next st and each st across. Turn.

Work this piece evenly until it matches the length of the sts in the hood.

#### **OPTIONAL:**

Next rows- Ch 2, hdc2tog, hdc in each hdc to last 2 sts, hdc2tog. Turn

Repeat this row until there are only 2 or 3 sts left. Hdctog the last 2 or 3 sts and fasten off.

Whipstitch together the row ends of the centerpiece to the stitch ends of the hood (leaving the last few rows of the center piece exposed for the point in the hood.)

#### **BORDER**

##### **Front Panels:**

Join yarn to the top corner of the front panel without buttonholes, ch 1, sc evenly along row ends to the bottom of the front panel.

Next Rows- Turn. Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Repeat until border is wide enough to sew buttons onto and reach the buttonholes on the other panel. ( 4-6 rows depending on size being made) Fasten off.

Join yarn in top corner of the front panel with the buttonholes, ch 1, and sc evenly

along row ends to the bottom of the panel. Turn

Next rows- Repeat same as for other panel except for the middle row of the border.

In the middle row, sc evenly along working (ch 2, sk 2 sc) in correspondence with the buttonholes made in the middle of the panel.

After middle row, continue to work sc evenly across until the same number of rows are made as for the other panel.

##### **Bottom-**

Join in bottom edge of the border of one of the front panels, ch 1, sc evenly through ( row ends of border, hdc of bottom of front panel, opposite side of foundation chain of back piece, hdc of bottom of other front panel, row ends of border) Turn

Next rows-Ch 1, sc in each sc across. Turn

Repeat for desired amount of rows for border.

##### **Hood-**

Join at the top edge of border of either front panel.

Ch 1, sc evenly across (row ends of border, opposite side of foundation chain of front panel,) sc2tog in last foundation ch and next row end of hood, sc evenly across row ends of hood until you reach the beginning of the point ( if you didn't make the point then disregard and sc in each hdc) sc2tog at the last row end before the point starts and the first row end of the point, sc evenly along the row ends of the point, 3 sc in the tip of the point, sc evenly along the row ends on

the opposite side of the point, sc2tog on the last row end of point and next row end of hood ( be sure number of sc is even on both sides of point or it will lay crooked), sc evenly along row ends of hood, sc2tog in last row end and first foundation ch of panel, sc evenly along opposite side of foundation ch of front panel, sc evenly along row ends. Ch 1 turn.

Next rows- Sc evenly across, working sc2tog ( or sc3tog) in each corner where previous sc2tog were worked and 3 sc in the tip of the point ( center of 3 sc previously worked).

Work border to desired width.

### **Sleeve-**

Join with sl st near bottom seam where sleeves were sewn together, ch 1, sc evenly along row ends.

Work as many or as few rows of sc as you like.

Fasten Off. Weave in all ends. Sew Buttons onto panel in correspondence with the buttonholes.
