PATTERN NOTES

This pattern is written in US terms and is designed to be flexible!

- You can use any type of yarn.
- Use a hook size to your choosing. For a firmer cowl a smaller hook is recommended. A larger hook will give you more of a drapey and delicate result.

CH3 counts as first DC throughout.

PATTERN TESTER INFORMATION

Sam Bennett

Sam used a Cotton Kings Twister Delux for her cowl. She started with 164 chains to get more length with the finer yarn.

Sam used a 3.5mm hook.

Tania Barry

Tania used Lion Brand Heartland in colourway Glacier Bay. She used 1 ball of 100g.

Tania used a 6.00mm hook.

Julie Jules

Julie used BWM Bloom 8 Ply for her cowl. She used 88g.

Julie used a 4.00mm hook.

Colleen O'Neill

Colleen used Spotlight Value Ball 10 Ply in a Mustard Color.

Colleen used a 8.00mm hook.




STITCH INFORMATION

○	Magic Circle	Magic Circle
○	CH	Chain
+	SC	Single Crochet
↓	DC	Double Crochet
X	Cross Stitch	3 Double Crochet Cross Stitch
Ⓐ	PIC3	3 Chain Picot
Ⓑ	PIC5	5 Chain Picot

STITCH NOTES:

Cross Stitch - When doing a cross stitch, skip one stitch, DC into next 2 stitches. Put the 3rd DC back into the missed stitch.

When working over a chain space, the first DC goes into the CH space, second into the next DC, then the last stitch is back over to the stitch you missed before the CH space.



PART 1 - Cowl Pattern

Chain 140 (Increase in multiples of 24 for a longer cowl or scarf)

Row 1 - DC into 5th chain from hook
DC each stitch across
CH 1 and turn
(137 DC)

Row 2 - SC into each stitch across
CH 3 and turn
(137 SC)


Row 3 - Cross Stitch across to last stitch

DC 1 into last stitch


CH 1 and turn

(2 DC, 45 Cross Stitches)

Repeat Rows 2 and 3 until cowl is the desired width.

PART 2 - The Border

Row 1 - SC into each stitch across

CH 3 and turn

(137 SC)

Row 2 - DC into second stitch

CH 1, skip 1 stitch, DC 1 Repeat to last stitch

DC 1 in last stitch

CH 1 and turn

(70 DC, 67 CH 1 Spaces)

Row 3 - SC into each stitch across

CH 3 and turn

(137 SC)

Row 4 - Cross Stitch across to last stitch

DC 1 into last stitch

CH 1 and turn

(2 DC, 45 Cross Stitches)

Row 5 - SC into each stitch across

CH 3 and turn

(137 SC)

Row 6 - DC into second stitch

CH 1, skip 1 stitch, DC 1 Repeat to last stitch

DC 1 in last stitch

CH 1 and turn

(70 DC, 67 CH 1 Spaces)

Row 7 - NOTE: CH 1 spaces count as a stitch on this row

SC 3

*CH 5, Skip the next 3 stitches (skip the DC 1, skip the CH 1, skip the DC 1),

SC 5* repeat to 6th last stitch

CH 5, Skip the next 3 stitches (skip the DC 1, skip the CH 1, skip the DC 1),

SC 3

CH 1 and turn

(86 SC, 17 CH 5 Spaces)

Row 8 - SC 2

*Into every CH 5 Space (DC 4, PIC3, DC 1, PIC5, DC 1, PIC3, DC 3)


Skip next 5 single crochets* repeat to the last CH 5 Space.

Into last CH 5 Space (DC 4, PIC3, DC 1, PIC5, DC 1, PIC3, DC 3)

SC 2

(17 Peaks)








The Border repeats every 8 Cross Stitches plus the end DC/SC (24 Stitches).

For easy reference the charts on the following pages are for those wishing to enlarge their cowl or make a scarf.

You can make it any size you like as did our testers!







PART 3 - Finishing Your Cowl

Once your Cowl is the width you like, and you have added your lovely border, you simply need to fold it over so the ends meet.

Use any method you like to join the ends together. You can slip stitch across, SC across or use a sewing needle.

Then you can add some beautiful buttons or even a shawl clip to give it the look you like.
