MATERIAL NEEDED
NB: 3.5 hook was used only to make the hair. I used

* 3.5 mm hook the 2.0 che for everything else, to keep the crochet thight
* 2.0 mm hook ( 2.5 is fine as well, depends on haw loosely you work)
* Tapestry needle
* 1 pair of black safety eyes 10 mm or some thing similar
* Stuffing: polyester fiberfill is the best, phd it's washable (which is very important if you're making a toy for kids). However, if you dou't have any, hormal .cotton wool will do the job.
* Stitch markers (always!: D)
* Light peach yarn for the 8 Kin ( 3.5 mm size)
* Darker orange yarn for hair ( 2.5 mm site)
* Lighter orange yarn for hair ( 3.5 mm site)
* Green-blue yarn for the dress ( 2 mm size)
* Beige yarn for the dress ( 2 mm site)
* Dark brown yarn for arrows and bow ( 2.5 mm site)
* Medium brown yarn for the bag ( 35 size)
* Light brown for arrows and bow ( 2.5 mm site)
* Very for black yarn for eyes details
* Very few Light-blue yarn for epis details

Don lt absolutely be afraid of using the supplies you already hove!
The work variates a lot from person to person, so small variations in the Green-blue supplies used will only make a marginal difference, as lang pas you know how to Rdapt : >

C DOLL's BODY A
$\downarrow$ the entire body is made in pale -peach yarn using 2.0 mm hook.

lull out the yarn and cut it. With a tapestry needle, pass the yarn through each stitch of the last round, then pull. Make a knot and hide the yarn inside the body of the doll.
Now, it's time to work on the arms $\downarrow$. Hake two, mit the yarn at the end and leave a long tail for sewing!
RI: 5 SC in magic ring (5) $\rightarrow$ As an alternative, if the ma gie ring should be too tight $R 2-R 9: 5 S C(5)$ for you, you con try this alternative:
RI: Ch $\sin 2,5 \mathrm{sc}$ in $2^{\text {nd }}$ loop from hook
It's less pretty, but it should make it easier to complete R2.

DRESS 4
$\checkmark$ start off with green-blue yarn, use hook 2.0
RI: Chain 21, start working next round from $2^{\text {nd }}$ stitch from hook (20)
R2: Sc, chain 2, skip 4, $6 s c$, chain 2, skip $4,3 s c(16) \rightarrow$ Here welre creating the holes
$R 3$ : $1 S c$, inc, $45 c$, inc, $2 S c$, inc, $4 S c$, inc, $15 C$ (20) for the arms
$R 4$ : $(45$, inc) $\times 4$ ( 24 )
R5-R10: 24 SC (24)

Make a slip-stitch at the end. Pull out the yarn, secure it with a knot and cut it. Hide the tail within the dress (the longer you leave it, the cosier it will be).
Now we freed the yarn and we can proceed with the sleeves :)
To start off the sleeve, you must join the yarn in the holes you created in R2, creating 8 stitches. This means that you have to make a stitch in each stitch of the hole ( 2 chain +4 skip $=6$ stitches) + you have to create 2 more by stitching in the junctures.

Now the dress is compered! You con put it on your doll and sow it ar the beck.
NB: when, as in this ese, the sleeves are mede to be very fight, it might be difficult to moke the arms pass through. I usually help myself pulling the arms with a piece of yarn ( you tie it to the arm, pass it through the sleeve and pull).

For the shoes, $\mu s e$ the dar her shade of brown, use 2.0 hook
RI : chain 5
RI: 3 sc in $2^{\text {ld }}$ loop from hack, $25 \mathrm{~S}, 25 \mathrm{C}$ in same loop, 2sc (12) $\}$ of RI and R2
RS: $9 S C$ in beck loop ally (9)
RA: $2 \mathrm{dec}, 5 \mathrm{sc}(7)$
Sew the shoes to the doll's feet!


HAIR 9
Use site 3.5 hook for the hair!
The hair is formed by two stratified loyers, to make them curlier (due layer would have worked as well, but saving the wig would ma de the curls fle Her).
The curls are always alternated: 1 twisted made with thinner orange yarn, 1 simple hair made with thi cher orange yarn (brighter aider).
First half: You could also just make all hairs "simple" dues (even loops ones).
Chain 15, create de hair in each loop of
the chain:
Odd loops: chain 22, 22 inc (twisted)
Even loops: chain 22,22 SC?

Sow this first half 8 rounds from the top of the head $\rightarrow$

Second half:
Chain 19. Odd loops end avon loops as above.
With the help of a tapestry needle, poss the yarn through the loops of the chain 13. Make a knot and tie it up to make all the loops converge


Sow this second half on the top of the head first. $\rightarrow 1$
Then sow each hair to the housed in correspondence $\rightarrow 2$ of the first half. Be aware not to pull them too muck, or you risk to spoil the curls!

ARRON-CARRIER BAG F 7
Use the middle shade of brown for the bag, use 2.0 hook

RI: chain 29
R2: Slip stitch in lade loop of the chain

R3: Using the same first loop RS R2, chain 6. Go beck with 5 slip stitches.
