

# *Pumpkin Headband*

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## ***Materials Needed:***

- Size N-15 hook (10mm) For pumpkin/stem/Curly-Q
- Size K-10.5 (6.5mm) for Leaf
- Lion Brand Wool-Ease, Thick and Quick, Color: Pumpkin  
(if you do not have thick yarn, 2 strands of any worsted weight will work just fine)
- Green and Tan Worsted weight for Stem, Leaf, Curly-Q

## ***Terms:***

Ch-chain, Sc-Single crochet, Dc-double crochet, sl st-slip stitch, sk-skip, sp-space

Hdc- Half double crochet

Tr- Treble (triple) crochet

Dtr- Double Treble crochet

ScDec- Single Crochet Decrease

F/O- fasten off

( \_ ) number of stitches at end of round/row

[ \_ ] numerous stitches to be completed in same Chain/Space.

\* \_ \* to be repeated

Round- continues in a circle

Row- Goes back and forth

### Instructions:

**Stem:** For stem of each pumpkin, I use green and tan together. You can use two strands of any color.

**Curly Q:** Size N-15 Hook

One Strand Worsted Weight

Ch 15, Hdc in 2<sup>nd</sup> from hook, \*Sk 1, Hdc in next\* repeat across

F/O



**Leaf:** Size K-10.5 hook

One Strand Worsted Weight

Ch 11, Turn

Row 1: Sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> from hook, Sc in nxt, Hdc in nxt, Hdc in nxt, Dc in nxt, Dc in nxt, [3 Tr in nxt], [3 Tr in nxt], [2 Dtr, Ch 4, Sl st in nxt]

Rotate so you are working in same Ch spaces, opposite side

[2 Dtr, Ch 4, Sl st in nxt], [3 Tr in nxt], [3 Tr in nxt], Dc in nxt, Dc in nxt, Hdc in nxt, Hdc in nxt, Sc in nxt, Sc in nxt.

F/O

Ch 7, Turn

Row 1: Hdc in 2<sup>nd</sup> Ch from hook, 5 Hdc across, Ch 1, Turn

Row 2-11: 6 Hdc across, Ch 1, Turn

Your rectangle should look like this.

Fold in half and slip stitch top of piece together.  
(between arrows)



Round 1: Change to stem color (strands of worsted or one chunky) and slip stitch 6 times around.



Round 2: Sl St to first Sl St, Ch 1, Sc Dec 3 times (reducing number of stitches from 6 to 3)

Round 3: Ch 1, Hdc around. (3 stitches)

Round 4: Sl st to Ch 1, Ch 1, Hdc around (3 stitches)

F/O

Pull Pumpkin Inside-Out. (Hide all loose ends inside pumpkin)



Take one strand of Yarn and weave through bottom and pull tight to close.



Take the loose ends and pull through top of pumpkin and back through bottom so it is scrunched up and not as tall.



Attach pumpkin and leaves to headband! (a skinny headband can easily be slipped through holes of pumpkin and leaves)

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
